Change is on its Way



The date 10 August 2011 will be forever etched into the Australian history books. It was the day the Federal Government announced that a National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) will soon become a reality.

This announcement reflects the Productivity Commission's final report on Disability Care and Support and is a tremendous victory for the tens of thousands of Every Australian Counts supporters who have worked hard to ensure the Federal Government paid attention and took rapid action for an NDIS. The Federal Coalition has also shown their support.

Building blocks are now being set in place so that the Scheme is rolled out Australia-wide by 2018-19.

While it may seem far away, the initiation of the process to establish an NDIS is highly significant to service providers such as Achieve Australia.

Achieve Australia Chief Executive Officer, Anne Bryce said: "This is very exciting news for everyone involved with our organisation, including staff, people we support and their families. People with disability will be empowered to have greater choice and flexibility when it comes to accessing support and services. Everything will be much more individualised and affordable."

In line with the 1,000 page report on Disability Care and Support, the Government, with the States and Territories, will:

- Deliver an immediate, additional \$10 million to support the technical policy work;
- Move to establish a COAG Select Council of Ministers from the Commonwealth, States and Territories to lead reform in this area;
- Take steps to establish an Advisory Group to the Select Council, led by Dr Jeff Harmer, to provide expert advice on delivering the foundations for reform and preparation for launch.

The NDIS will be launched in stages and not fully implemented until 2018-19. However, regional launch sites will operate in 2014 to enable the new system to be tested and fine tuned. It is vital for the NDIS to be built on the security of a guaranteed and sustainable funding commitment.

Every Australian Counts Campaign Director, John Della Bosca, said "This is the biggest socio-economic reform Australia has seen since the introduction of Medicare. It will have a transformational impact on our community and our economy."

Achieve Australia would like to thank our staff and members of the community who have helped support the Every Australian Counts campaign.

We look forward to a very bright future for the provision of disability services in our country.

Creating more choice, security and economic benefits

We are currently taking significant steps towards the improvement of housing for many people.

Achieve Australia has proposed the redevelopment of Crowle Home at Belmore Street, Ryde to build a 470 residential dwelling development. The organisation will be retaining up to 10% of the apartments for people with disability.

If approved, the co-housing model will see the people we support living within the community, allowing us to move a step closer towards achieving social inclusion. The redevelopment will also ensure economic security for Achieve Australia for many years to come, potentially funding ongoing improvements across all of our services. You can read more information about the proposed development in our special centrefold lift-out on pages 8 and 9.

While change often brings uncertainty, processes have been developed to aid the transition process into community living for current residents. We have been hosting frequent transition meetings and are increasing overall communications via our website, Twitter, blog and new e-newsletter to keep everyone up to date. Our

managers are also readily available to answer any questions that you may have.

Thank you to the dedicated team working diligently behind the scenes to help make the redevelopment possible, including Meadowbank Public School for donating the use of their hall for our Community Information Session.

These exciting plans are well-aligned with the recent announcement that a National Disability Insurance Scheme is on the way. Just like the new development, an NDIS will ensure financial certainty for people with disability and their families by allowing more choice in accessing support and services. Achieving Employment – You’ve come to the right place

Our Disability Employment Services, known as Achieve Employment, have been assisting people with disability, injury or health condition to find and keep paid employment for nearly 25 years. We have also provided opportunities to expand educational experiences and qualifications and run a Transition to Work program for school leavers.

Funded by the Department of Education Employment & Workplace Relations (DEEWR), a combination of Achieve Employment’s modern facilities, technology and qualified staff ensure that both jobseekers and employers experience a smooth transition into open employment.

The Jobseeker Process



1. Job Capacity Assessment or Direct Registration

The jobseeker is referred to Achieve Employment by Centrelink or will register directly with us.



2. Jobseeker Plan

An individualised plan is formed with the jobseeker to determine a pathway into employment that meets their goals.



3. Job Analysis

Achieve Employment visits a potential workplace and qualified trainers conduct a thorough analysis on the company and job role.



4. Job Match

The employer is presented with three of our most suitable candidates based on the Job Analysis; ultimately the employer chooses who to hire.



5. On The job Training

The worker is trained for the role for up to three months full time, which includes teaching them how to perform their duties.



6. Ongoing Support in the Workplace

Achieve Employment visits the worker once a week to ensure their success in their role.

Getting more people into the workforce - Changes to the Disability Support Pension

Over the last three budgets, the Australian Government has initiated a series of reforms to fundamentally overhaul key aspects of the Disability Support Pension (DSP) to get more people into the workforce and eliminate a lifetime spent on income support.

The most recent changes announced in July 2011 involve the introduction of new Impairment Tables that reflect today's medical and rehabilitation practice, ensuring a person's ability is reviewed when assessing their eligibility for the Pension, not just their disability or mental health problem.

There will also be more support for employers to cover the costs of recruiting and training when hiring someone with disability.

Jenny Mackin MP, Community Services Manager, said "Many people with disability are great contributors, and many more want to do more. We want to ensure we get the system right so that it encourages and rewards effort, and doesn't penalise initiative."

At Achieve Employment, only 26% of people placed in work currently receive the Disability Support Pension. As a whole, 48% of workers don't receive any Government allowances at all.

Operations Manager, Achieve Employment, Martine Porret said "Our aim at Achieve Employment is to help reduce the dependency and need for a Disability Support Pension. We want the people placed in open employment to have as much independence as possible."

Exciting redevelopments at Crowle Home

Have you heard the news? Achieve Australia has taken the next step in our overall Housing Strategy – we have put forward a proposal for the redevelopment of Crowle Home.

If our Concept Plan is accepted, 76 Belmore Street, Ryde will soon become known as ‘Crowle Gardens’; a 470 dwelling residential development with Achieve Australia retaining up to 10% of the apartments for people with disability.

Similar co-housing developments have proved to be highly successful overseas and in other parts of Australia.

So what does this mean for Achieve Australia and the people we support?

This ground breaking project will make a significant difference for people with disability by providing greater choice and creating a high level of excellence in ‘fit for purpose’ facilities. The security and economic self sufficiency created will also allow us to improve other services we provide, including community living, employment, day programs and respite.

In addition, Achieve Australia will become less dependent on rentals and increase the ownership of our properties.

Overall, by opening up the purchase of apartments to the broader community, we will be one step closer to our vision of achieving social inclusion.

Chief Executive Officer, Anne Bryce said, “Services for people with disability across Australia are in crisis. We are incredibly fortunate that we have the opportunity to develop and extend our facilities and programs for people with disability and their families in this area.”



The proposed plans for redevelopment

Why redevelop Crowle Home?

Crowle Home was established on the Belmore Street site in 1952 and is no longer suitable for the needs or expectations of the ageing residents. Many of the buildings are now unusable and have already been closed.

We are confident that our proposed residential development will substantially improve the living conditions of people we support, while creating social integration with the surrounding community.

The long history of the property will be honoured with the restoration and retention of the heritage listed Tellaraga house (Crowle Home) and memorial gardens.

What will happen to the current residents at Crowle Home?

While there is a possibility that some people can stay on the property during the redevelopment, residents may need or want to be relocated at some stage in the process.

However, with a timeline for the redevelopment not currently in

place, we will continue to move residents into alternative housing within our community living program.

What about the Vintage and Value Enterprises?

Thanks to the dedication and hard work of volunteers, the Vintage and Value Enterprises have become part of the heart and soul of our organisation.

After running onsite for many years, it is our intention to work with the volunteers to discuss a new location for these important community activities.

What happens next?

After our public exhibition period ends, the Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DoPI) will assess our Environmental Assessment Report (EA) and submissions received to determine approval and conditions.

Following DoPI approval, a Development Application will be prepared and submitted to Ryde Council.

Achieve Australia will seek a joint venture partner for the next part of the planning process.

What's the update on Araluen?

Everything is progressing well at the new innovative hub for Day Programs and Respite. Renovations at Araluen should be completed over the next six weeks and our staff are currently finalising transition plans and exciting new educational and creative programs.



Renovations are in the final weeks!

- Bathrooms have been completed.
- Outdoor areas now feature access ramps, pathways and recreational decking.
- Electrical installations are in process.
- Interior painting is nearly finished.
- The old kitchen has been stripped out and we have engaged contractors for the installation of a new accessible kitchen.
- The lift, manufactured in Italy, has now arrived in Australia and is in the process of being installed. It will be installed at the same time as the kitchen.
- Once everything is finalised, we will be bringing out the beautiful furniture and crockery from storage.

Day Program activities – Watch this space!

Our staff has had several training days in preparation for the transition from Belmore Street, including visits to various locations across Sydney for inspiration for new activities. We have also received great ideas and feedback from Day Program participants and their families. After much collaboration, a shopping list of equipment required for future programs has now been devised.

A photography project has begun with students from University of Western Sydney, which will hopefully include our first photographic exhibition at Araluen in late 2011. We are also aiming to form an alliance with Northern Sydney TAFE to establish learning and training initiatives.
